Fostering Collective Teacher Efficacy

A key to turning around schools that struggle to support student-learning lies in the ability of formal and informal leaders to cultivate collective efficacy. Exemplary leadership practices highlighted in the research and considered highly effective in relation to developing collective teacher efficacy will be explored throughout this session. In addition, understanding and attending to school characteristics associated with collective teacher efficacy will increase the likelihood that collective efficacy will be enhanced. Participants will consider how to plan and organize actions, implement changes, observe and monitor outcomes, and reflect on strategies for fostering collective teacher efficacy.

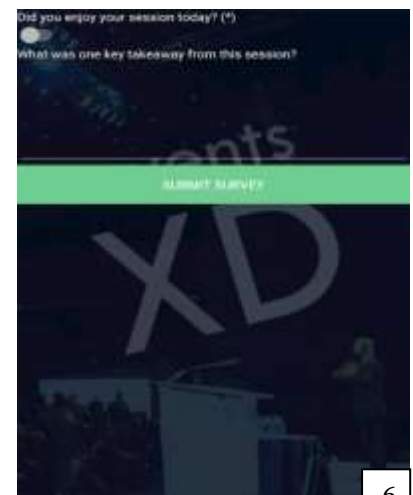

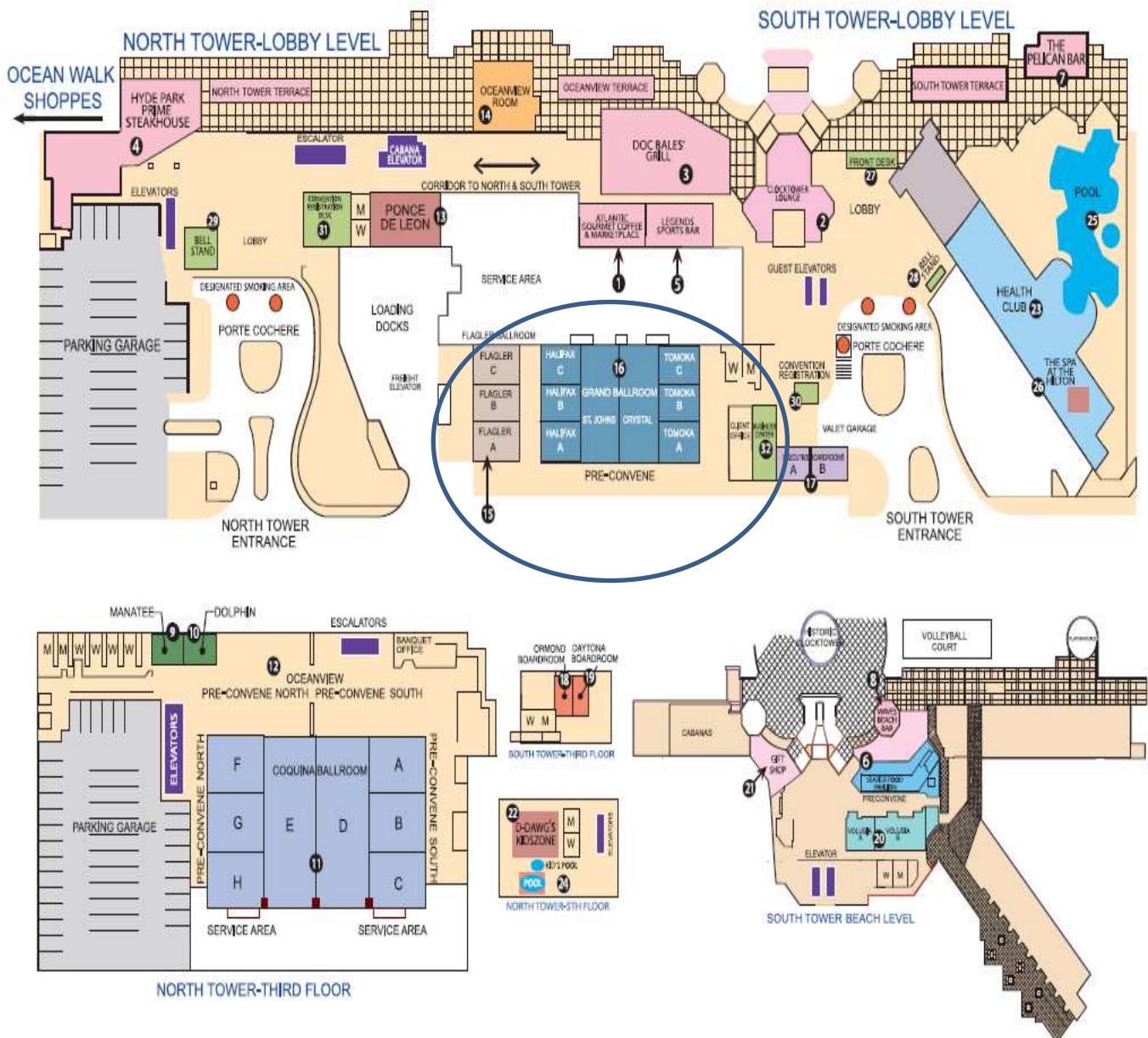
